



MORE BARS IN ANGELES

Following our two previous stories about Bar Hopping in Angels City in the Philippines we move on down Field Avenue. In the following we will give you some ideas about the various bars with some statements from people who have visited them.

Lollipop: The old Cozy Cleo. "Now next thing I know I'm standing in front of Lollipop, and it is like a magnetic force drawing me in, and who am I to resist such a force, so in I go. First person I see is Mo, well I had talked to him earlier and he had remarked about the great looking girls at Lollipop, man was that an understatement, there were wall to wall beautiful young girls everywhere, the music was cranked and the whole place was

in party mode."

Gecko's (formerly Y Bar): It is a small cozy bar. Horst, the former owner, sold the bar to an American. "The ownership has changed and Y Bar is now a mere shadow of what it once was. It used to be a smaller version of Champagne (previous owner the same), packed with girls and consistently one of the highest ratios of lookers in town. It now has about a third of the girls it used to have and few attractive ones. The decline of Y Bar is a very disappointing turn of events for me, but who knows what the future will bring.", "Y Bar's found a new life. The girls are fun, lively and very, very attractive."

Owl's Nest (formerly Club Fantastic): Another bar left

over from the base days. It's a large place with between 8 and 10 dancers, but the quality varies. "It should be renamed Club FAT FARM. I had never



seen so many fat dancers as they had in Club FAT FARM. As you go through the clubs you might see one or two overweight dancers, but in Club Cellulite there was only one or two

averaged weight dancers. The best thing about Club Mega-Big is the waitresses. There were three very nice looking ones in there. I went inside three times and each time I was the only customer in there. Staff was about average."

Angels Club (formerly Papillon): The owner is focusing on drinks and fun rather than the extreme pressure for ladies drinks that has been its reputation. The lineup is good.

DMZ Bar: Smallest go-go bar on lower Field Avenue. It has 2 pool tables and a snack menu. Run by a former

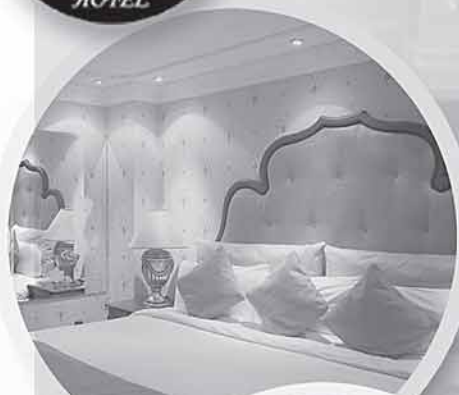
US Marine. Pool tables stay busy most of the evening. Renovated, with the dance floor now in the center of the main room. The quality of the girls is fair to poor. Not one good looker in the place. The girls push very hard for drinks.

Dollhouse (formerly Wet Seals, Cottontails, Love Boat, Titanic): Open 02/11/2005 after a P6 million renovation. Large go-go bar on Field Avenue. P1200 bar fine. It plans to operate 24 hours. "They have a round stage in the middle like Las Vegas. The girls were decent in looks and body. Not a lot of fat bellies (like to argue that it is not Jollibee but too many chips and soft drinks) like a few other big bars in town. There are three types of entertainment. About eight girls

dance a choreograph couple of songs. Then a single girl dances to a couple of songs. Then a different group of about 15 girls dance on the dance floor.", "I can't understand why anyone would build a replica of the Pick-Up, which is the biggest white elephant in Angeles."

Rick's Cafe: Videos throughout the day. It has a nice internet center. I used it once when Kokomo's was off-line. My page came right up and I made a print using their color printer. "The steak and egg breakfast is top notch, and it's a great place to kill a few hours and watch a movie. I've only had breakfast there because lunch and dinner are Thai food at Margarita Station or a steak at Mo's Steakhouse as far as I'm concerned."

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
